

Benefits of BMAP Over 28 Years

Though it is extremely difficult to quantify such benefits as “vehicle accidents prevented” or “lives saved,” the protection of public health and safety is a main goal of the program.

23,017 Total Landowner Agreements

12,900 private agreements

10,117 DOT agreements

11,827 adjacent landowners benefited



36,395 Total Dams Removed

24,209 removed manually

12,186 removed with explosives



BMAP accounts for the removal of about 0.5% of the state’s beaver population annually.


