## **Emergency/Temporary Amendment to 15A NCAC 10F .0314 New Hanover County Recommended by Agency Staff for Adoption**

The proposed amendment creates a no-wake zone in the waters of the Cape Fear River in Wilmington, 160 yards southwest of the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge on Business US Hwy 17.

NC Department of Transportation (NCDOT) has subcontracted with a geotechnical engineering firm to conduct soil testing and to evaluate the condition of the soil and rock beneath the Cape Fear River, south of the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge. This investigation is to develop foundation recommendations for the bridge replacement, NCDOT Project Number HB-0039.

To gather the necessary information, a drill machine has been attached to a barge and affixed to specific points at proposed bridge bent locations. The nature of the drilling rig requires drill operators to be stationed at the rear of the equipment, placing the workers at the extreme bow or stern end of the barge. They are drilling up to 250' deep, using about 300' of drilling rod, which comes in and out of the boring hole dozens of times per day.

Vessels moving under and around the bridge above no-wake speed endanger the safety of operators on the barge. Barge stability is critical to ensure that operators are not thrown from the barge, thrown into moving drilling equipment, or crushed under falling equipment. Operators are not advised to tether themselves to the barge as tethers pose an entanglement hazard around moving drilling equipment. Thus, a stable barge is critical to ensure drilling safety.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Wilmington District was consulted, and concur, with proposed rulemaking in the federal channel.

The NCDOT will be responsible for implementing this rule. The temporary no-wake zone is expected to be lifted approximately two months after the effective date.

*15A NCAC 10F .0314 NEW HANOVER COUNTY*

1 15A NCAC 10F .0314 is amended under emergency procedures as follows:

3 **15A NCAC 10F .0314 NEW HANOVER COUNTY**

4 (a) Regulated Areas. This Rule applies to the following waters in New Hanover County:

- 5 (1) the area bounded on the north by the U.S. Highway 74-76 bridge crossing the Intracoastal  
6 Waterway, on the south by a line shore to shore intersecting Intracoastal Waterway channel marker  
7 number 127, on the west by the shore of Wrightsville Sound, and on the east by a line perpendicular  
8 to U.S. Highway 74-76 and intersecting channel marker number 25 in Motts Channel;
- 9 (2) the area of Motts Channel between channel marker number 25 at the Intracoastal Waterway on the  
10 west and channel marker number 16 at the entrance from Banks Channel on the east;
- 11 (3) Wilmington. The waters shore to shore in that portion of Bradley Creek in the City of Wilmington  
12 between the U.S. Highway 76 bridge crossing Bradley Creek and a point at 34.20794 N, 77.82158  
13 W, near the mouth of Bradley Creek;
- 14 (4) Lee's Cut from its western intersection with the Intracoastal Waterway at 34.21979 N, 77.80965 W,  
15 to its eastern intersection with Banks Channel at 34.21906 N, 77.79645 W;
- 16 (5) Town of Wrightsville Beach. The unnamed channel lying between the shore west of Bahama Drive  
17 in the Town of Wrightsville Beach and an unnamed island located approximately 500 feet northeast  
18 of the U.S. Highway 74 bridge over Banks Channel; and
- 19 (6) Castle Hayne. The waters of the Northeast Cape Fear River between the U.S. Highway 117 bridge  
20 and the railroad trestle 60 yards east of the Castle Hayne Boating Access Area, 6418 Orange Street,  
21 Castle Hayne.
- 22 (7) the waters of the Cape Fear River in Wilmington shore to shore, 160 yards southwest of the Cape  
23 Fear Memorial Bridge on Business US Hwy 17, north of a line from a point on the west shore at  
24 34.22675 N, 77.95400 W, to a point on the east shore at 34.22567 N, 77.95109 W.

25 (b) Speed Limit. No person shall operate a vessel at greater than no-wake speed within any of the regulated areas  
26 described in Paragraph (a) of this Rule.

27 (c) Placement of Markers. The Board of Commissioners of New Hanover County shall place the no-wake markers  
28 implementing Subparagraphs (a)(1), (a)(2), (a)(3), (a)(4), and (a)(5) of this Rule, subject to the approval of the United  
29 States Coast Guard and the United States Army Corps of Engineers.

30 (d) Placement and Maintenance of Markers. The Wildlife Resources Commission shall place and maintain markers  
31 for the area designated in Subparagraph (a)(6) of this Rule, subject to the approval of the United States Coast Guard  
32 and the United States Army Corps of Engineers.

33 (e) Placement of Markers. The North Carolina Department of Transportation shall be the designated agency  
34 implementing Subparagraph (a)(7) of this Rule.

## **Proposed Temporary Amendments to 15A NCAC 10C .0218 Harvest Reporting Requirements Recommended by Agency Staff for Public Notice, Comment, and Presentation at Public Hearing**

The proposed temporary amendments add additional detail for locations where harvest reporting requirements are mandatory. The amendments add clarity and will better ensure the regulated community understands where this rule applies.

*15A NCAC 10C .0218 HARVEST REPORTING REQUIREMENTS*

1 15A NCAC 10C .0218 is proposed for amendment under temporary procedures as follows:

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3 **15A NCAC 10C .0218 HARVEST REPORTING REQUIREMENTS**

4 (a) For the purpose of this Rule, the following definitions shall apply:

5 (1) "Division" means the North Carolina Division of Marine Fisheries.

6 (2) "inland fishing waters adjacent to joint or coastal fishing waters" means inland fishing waters  
7 upstream of joint or coastal fishing waters of the Roanoke River downstream of Roanoke Rapids  
8 Dam, the Tar River downstream of Rocky Mount Mill Dam, the Neuse River downstream of Falls  
9 Lake Dam and the Cape Fear River downstream of Buckhorn Dam, and their tributaries extending  
10 upstream to the first impoundment, Roanoke, Tar, Neuse, and Cape Fear rivers and their tributaries  
11 extending upstream to the first impoundment of the main course on the river or its tributaries, and  
12 in all other inland fishing waters east of Interstate 95 except in the Lumber and Waccamaw rivers  
13 River and their its tributaries.

14 (3) "harvest" means catching or taking a fish and reducing it to permanent possession by not returning  
15 it to the water.

16 (b) An individual who harvests the following species, from joint fishing waters or inland fishing waters adjacent to  
17 joint or coastal fishing waters, shall report the information required in Rule 15A NCAC 03I .0124(b) to the Division  
18 at <https://www.ncmarinefisheries.net> or record the harvest on a Division-issued report card when harvest is complete:

19 (1) flounder;

20 (2) red drum;

21 (3) spotted seatrout;

22 (4) striped bass; and

23 (5) weakfish.

24 (c) Individuals using a Division-issued report card shall report the information electronically at  
25 <https://www.ncmarinefisheries.net> in a manner consistent with requirements of Rule 15A NCAC 03I .0124(b).

26 (d) An individual shall not remove the head or tail or otherwise change the appearance of the fish to render it  
27 impractical to identify, count, or measure while fishing or afield and until harvest has been recorded or reported.

28 (e) The requirements of this Rule shall be effective in accordance with the schedule in S.L. 2023-137, s. 6(f).

## **Proposed Temporary Amendments to 15A NCAC 10C .0414 Bluefish Recommended by Agency Staff for Public Notice, Comment, and Presentation at Public Hearing**

The proposed temporary amendments increase the daily creel limit from three fish to five fish.

*15A NCAC 10C .0414 BLUEFISH*

15A NCAC 10C .0414 is proposed for amendment under temporary procedures as follows:

**15A NCAC 10C .0414 BLUEFISH**

- (a) The daily creel limit for bluefish is five, ~~three~~.
- (b) There is no size limit.
- (c) There is no closed season.
- (d) Bluefish shall not be sold.
